# SWANSEA ASTRONOMICAL SOCIETY IS SIXTY YEARS OLD.

wansea Astronomical Society will be celebrating its 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary on Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> February 2008. This will be marked with a daylong event to be held in the Dylan Thomas Centre. The programme of speakers throughout the day will include Andy Lound of the Planetary Society and Professor Mike Edmunds of the University of Wales, Cardiff. An exhibition of members' astronomical and historical photographs will be displayed, as well as several national and local trade stands.

The Society was formed in 1948 and in 1993 assumed the tenancy of the Marina Towers Observatory on the Swansea sea front. The Towers houses a 20-inch Shafer-Maksutov telescope, the largest astronomical telescope in Wales, as well as offices and a teaching and exhibition room. The domed observatory is reached via a 76-step spiral staircase that is home to a 50-foot high scale model of the Solar System.

The site is visited every week during term time by schools from Swansea, Llanelli, Neath and Port Talbot. In addition to this scholastic contribution, the Society invites the general public to attend monthly Winter and Spring 'Star' evenings and weekly afternoons in the Summer months, as well as offering a practical observing course for beginners.

# FAS CONVENTION 2007

he annual FAS convention was once again hosted at the Birmingham Midland Institute. Last year I commented on the poor air conditioning at this venue so I should start by reporting that this year the air quality in the main auditorium was much improved. With a less oppressive atmosphere it was possible to admire what is in fact a very well designed lecture theatre. Refreshment provision would also have been good had the Coffee Bar not closed before the afternoon tea break. To be positive, however, the sale of sandwiches during the lunch break was a much appreciated improvement. This area of Birmingham seems to offer only the Starbucks experience within easy walking distance. The event was once again well organised and the mid-day business meeting was conducted efficiently. We were treated this year to a well balanced and entertaining programme of lectures on a range of topics, the range of trade stands provided good browsing material and the celebrated FAS raffle enabled the Brannel Astronomy delegates to once again walk away with prizes which makes the long drive from Cornwall worthwhile. Surely our luck cannot continue - but watch this space!

Jerry Stone from Letchworth and District AS started the proceedings with a review of the do's and don'ts on Running a Star Party. This talk could have been just a list - and yes, it was a list, but Jerry gave a series of forcefully presented arguments for good planning and lots of good advice for organising a successful event. I came away convinced that 'Failure to Prepare' was indeed 'Preparation for Failure'. A list? - Yes, but an excellent list.

Prof. Mike Cruise from The University of Birmingham talked on The Search for Gravitational Waves. He reviewed the origins, history and nature of gravitational radiation and described in detail the current efforts to achieve direct detection of this predicted consequence of General Relativity. With the inexorable loss of energy by the double pulsar providing overpowering evidence that Einstein's predictions concerning these ripples in the fabric of space-time are correct, their direct detection has remained elusive. Prof. Cruise reviewed the construction of the 4 km baseline LIGO laser interferometric detector which will make possible detection of gravitational radiation in the 10 Hz - 10 kHz range. LIGO is expected to detect radiation from supernova events in 3-4 years. He went on to preview the construction and launch (scheduled for 2018) of the 5 million km baseline phase locked laser interferometric detector LISA. Destined for an Earth tracking orbit, this device should be capable of detecting high frequency gravitational echoes of the Big Bang. Our total dependence on electromagnetic radiation as an information carrier may soon be over.

Samuel George reviewed preparations by the IAS to mark the 2009 International Year of Astronomy. In the UK emphasis would be given to Dark Sky Awareness but there were plans to have a Universal Astronomy Day on July 21<sup>st</sup>. A solar eclipse would occur on the

## Javea & District Astonomical Society to Link Up With The U3A The Javea and District Astronomical Society (J&DAS) meets on the first Monday of each month.

Javea is located midway between Valencia and Alicante on the Costa Blanca in Spain. In October 2007, however, the Society became one of the many clubs/societies within the popular U3A (University of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Age) organisation which is based in nearby Dénia.

The U3A is a voluntary organisation dedicated to providing educational, recreational, cultural and social opportunities to its members. Its multinational membership is open to all who are no longer in full time employment. It has been going from strength to strength in recent years in Spain and has opened a branch in Dénia which already has a membership in excess of 400 people. The organisation provides its members with access to various groups which are run on a voluntary basis by people who have a skill or interest that they wish to share. Members pay a nominal annual fee

to U3A and then join any of the groups which appeal to them.

Prior to the J&DAS joining forces with the U3A, the Dénia branch of the U3A did not have an astronomical group. Additionally, the J&DAS was looking for opportunities to expand its membership and raise its profile. Both organisations have now benefited from the association; the U3A will provide its members with access to a new and interesting group and the J&DAS membership has seen a threefold increase as a direct result of the access to a large pool of potential new members. Furthermore, the J&DAS is now able to use the well established communications methods of the U3A to reach more people, i.e., via the U3A website, meetings and networking.

# JERSEY ASTRONOMY MOVES SOUTH

he island of Jersey is separated from the French coast by a series of smaller rocky *reefs* many visited by yachtsmen and fishermen during the low water period. They carry quaint names, the Ecrehous reef lies to the East, the Paternosters to the North but dwarfing them all is the Minquiers reef 11 miles from Jersey's South coast and 10 from the nearest French islands.

On Jersey, the Astronomy Club's main base is the Sir Patrick Moore Centre near the south-west coast and WAS the most southern public observatory in the British Isles. That changed when a decision was made to install a small observing facility on the Minquiers Reef. The only possible place above the high water mark is on a small island called the Maitresse Ile where a group of small stone cottages, once used by fishermen, cling to the rock formation. Only a couple of hundred feet in length at high water the Ile can be located at 48.58.30 North and 002.03.69 West.

The island of Jersey measures eight by seven miles, at spring tides the rise and fall can total 40 feet, so the tidal movement is fierce. At the Minquiers, at low water, the overall land mass is larger than Jersey. The main inhabitants are seabirds, seals, and pods of dolphins or porpoises.

Nine members of the astronomy club boarded a powerful launch owned by committee member and Master Mariner Frank Lawrence. Frank who owns one of the small cottages has made hundreds of trips to the reef over a period of years and is an expert at navigating the narrow channels. On board, apart *from* essential supplies, water, food and other 'refreshments' the crew brought two three inch refractors, and within minutes of landing both were set up and trained on the sun. The 'seeing' appeared to be clearer than on the mainland and at night with me lack of light pollution the nights are stunning. Refractors were selected as the best telescopes to deploy as in a very short time mirrors would suffer from salt contamination. One telescope is housed in a cottage and can be used by visitors to the reef, any who wish to remain overnight must bring all their supplies with them including sleeping bags and any extra optical equipment.

The Jersey Astronomy Club is twinned with the South Downs Society and Chichester Planetarium.

following day and he noted that 2009 was the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Apollo Landing. Sam urged all delegates to participate in a wideranging discussion of activities to be held during a number of focus weeks.

Prof. Philip Diamond of the Jodrell Bank Centre for Astrophysics talked of the history of The Jodrell Bank Radio Telescope, he reviewed on-going research at the installation and looked to the future of this iconic instrument. Prof. Diamond talked of the early work made possible by the construction of the telescope which was started in 1952, 'looked like a dish' in 1956 and first moved in 1957. He recalled the use of the telescope to detect signals from Sputnik, to record close up picture telemetry of the lunar surface, the discovery of quasars, of OH molecular emission, work on gravitational lensing and on pulsars. The instrument had been upgraded in 1971 but had been very nearly lost during the violent storms of 1976. The future of the telescope now lies largely in its role (since the 1980's) as a key player in long (and in continental scale very long) baseline radio interferometry and through the MERLIN and eMERLIN projects. There is clearly great affection for this the largest moving grade one listed building.

Prof. Colin Pillinger reminded us that Space is a Funny Place by reviewing 50 years or so of Space Exploration. He recounted a series of anecdotes including that it was Harriot (1560 - 1621) who first observed the moon through a telescope and who brought back tobacco with Walter Raleigh. Prof. Pillinger quickly homed in on what is clearly his dominant scientific interest - the exploration of Mars and the search there for extraterrestrial life. He reviewed the history of the Beagle II project from scientific, political and financial viewpoints, revealing not unexpectedly that it is this project which continues to occupy his mind and his enthusiasm - notably when he reported

proposals that NASA might yet use Beagle II technology in their near future lunar exploration programmes.

Another great day of astronomy. Congratulations to all who contributed to the planning and smooth running. We look forward to 2008.

# **Stargazers' Almanac 2008** Monthly guide to the stars and planets 32pp; 420 x 297mm; 1 903458 75 7 - £12.99

'Explore the wonders of the night skies with Stargazers' Almanac 2008 ~ no telescope required! Track the planets, locate the Milky Way, discover the heavenly Giraffe, Orion's dogs and Draco the dragon, recognise the signs of the zodiac and watch meteor showers and other planetary phenomena.' - so says the description on the website advertising this publication.

For once, the advertising blurb does not exaggerate. This is a well produced and attractive product.

At one level it is a simple calendar, but on another it is a pretty comprehensive almanac of the heavens.

Each monthly chart features a double spread giving views of the night sky looking north and looking south. It also shows the daily phases of the moon and a guide to altitude at transit. In addition there are observing notes covering not only 'what is up' that month but also some of the facts and myths associated with the stars and planets.

This year's edition has been extended to includes 'Star Legends Season by Season' - covering Spring– Ursa Major; Summer–Ophiuchus; Autumn– Pisces; and Winter–The Pleiades.

There is a page on spotting satellites and also a page on light pollution.

Produced at A3 landscape format it is designed to hang from a central wire loop in the rear binding. However this only lasts until 1st January, when it will be hung from a hole in the bottom of the page, converting it to A2 portrait format.

All in all a nice and useful product.

# OBITUARY. DAVID EARLY 1932-2007

It was with a great sense of sadness and shock that we, at the Luton Astronomical Society learnt of the sudden death of David Early in April. He had been an active member of the Society since its inception in 1969; holding the post of President and Programme Secretary for much of that time.

Each year, during his long stint as Program Secretary, he never failed to provide an excellent and diverse series of lectures covering all aspects of astronomy and cosmology. David had the ability to attract some of the leading professionals and amateurs in both these fields.

It would be untrue to say that every talk went without a hitch. On those rare occasions where a speaker failed to materialize, due to illness, severe weather conditions or getting lost on route, David stepped in and proved to be an accomplished, informative and most entertaining speaker.

He had a keen interest in many aspects of astronomy. His observational work detailed in his excellent photographic, oil paintings and pastel records portray a man of great skill and accomplishment. The Crab Nebula, Hale Bopp, Solar Eclipses and the Harvest Moon were just some of his subjects.

As President of the Luton Astronomical Society David, while always available to advise and help members, gave a sense of gravitas that encouraged and instilled a sense of order and responsibility in the workings of the committee and membership.

One might have expected David to have taken up astronomy as a full time career, but after having spent a spell working in banking, ever an individualist, he went into teaching and brought astronomy with him. A number of his past students credited David with having

kindled an interest in astronomy in their own lives.

Indeed, David's passion for educating the masses led to him presenting numerous WEA courses in Cambridgeshire and Bedfordshire.

While his keen intellect, his photographic, artistic and observational skills, his administrative acumen and last though not least, his warm and genuine friendship will be sorely missed by all, we rejoice in having experienced his presence in our lives.
